



## Operators' Memo 2020/2

### Revised Department for Transport Guidelines for GA Flights

#### Introduction

This afternoon (Friday 15 May 2020) the DfT revised its guidance on General Aviation flights.

Recreational flights from aerodromes in England is now permitted for solo flights or flights where everyone is from the same household. **Social distancing must be strictly observed.** Full details are available [here](#).

#### Redhill Procedures

The tower is currently operated by one ATCO per day therefore any pilots wishing to fly from Redhill between now and 31 May 2020 must obtain PPR for outbound and inbound flights, even if you are based at the Aerodrome. This should be done by email [atc@redhillaerodrome.com](mailto:atc@redhillaerodrome.com) or telephone 01737 821802. Email is the preferred means of contact.

If it is necessary for ATC to close, for any reason, a message will be broadcast on the ATIS stating "Redhill ATC is closed. The Aerodrome is temporarily closed to all traffic except police and air ambulance flights." During these periods remain outside the ATZ until the Tower reopens.

Should you attend the Aerodrome please do not bring any additional people unless they will be flying with you.

Pilots are reminded that:

1. No visitors, including pilots, will be permitted in the ATC Unit or the Fire Station. Any payments for landing fees or fuel will be taken, outside the building, by credit card machine and the receipt sent by email
2. When out and about the duty ARFFS crew will keep a minimum distance of 2m between themselves and anyone.

#### AVGAS 100LL Fuelling

The ARFFS is operating at Category A1/H1 (2 crew) which means if they are out providing Jet A1 there will be a delay for AVGAS. **Social distancing must be strictly observed.** Fuelling of NPAS and AAKSS will take priority.
